## SHARING THE BREAD AND CUP

A few instructions about communion:

- All servers will sanitize hands immediately before serving communion.
- When prompted by the pastor, please come forward down the center aisle in two lines.
- When you get to your serving station, extend your cupped hands, and a server will place a piece of bread into your hands.
- After eating the bread, take a cup of grape juice from the tray, being careful not to touch other cups.
- After drinking the cup, place the used cup into the basket on the pedestal by the stone column.
- Then return to your pew by the side aisles.
- Gluten-free wafers are available in the Narthex.
