Saturday night's program includes a social hour with music, dinner, remarks by former pastors, and a video about our church's rich history.



### **Music Program Update**

Culmination- "the highest or climatic point of something, especially as attained after a long time." We are about to experience the culmination of a year's music activities as we will celebrate the 175th anniversary. It has been a pleasure to plan the many music performances to help in this celebration.

Music has had an important part in the worship at Central. Many things point to this fact. Having the quality of the 43-rank Aeolian-Skinner Pipe Organ in the sanctuary helps to lead the congregation in the singing of hymns. A few years ago, the AGO held their convention in Des Moines and the Central Presbyterian organ was presented in an evening concert. The purchase of the Whitechapel Handbells is an additional indication of the importance of music. The dedicated people in the Chancel Choir and their commitment to weekly rehearsals and Sunday morning services is an additional indication of music importance. We also enjoy the music of the Children's Chorus and RingTones during worship.

So it was only fitting that we began a "concert a month" back in December, which has led us to the culmination on June 11th. During the service, the Morgen Bells will present the commissioned work by Mike Mazzatenta and will be premiered during the offertory. This work, "Reflect and Rejoice," was commissioned in honor and recognition of Sue Hudson, in her founding and directing the Morgen Bells for many years. The Chancel Choir has been working on the Randall Thompson choral work, "The Last Words of David," a powerful work using the text from 2 Samuel xxiii, 3, 4. I hope that those who attended the many concerts and performances have enjoyed the music here at Central. It is now time for the choir to take a much deserved break and recharge for the activities being planned for next year. I am looking for anyone who would like to present a selection (vocal, instrumental, etc.) in the anthem spot during the service. If you would like to help us, please contact me and I will help schedule you for a Sunday.

As always, it is a pleasure to serve the congregation at Central.

### **Deacons Make Gift to Eat Greater Des Moines**

Central's Board of Deacons has made another significant gift as a part of our church's mission "tithe" from last year's easement agreement with 3801 Grand. They have chosen to give \$3,250 to Eat Greater Des Moines (EGDM), a ten year-old non-profit based in Des Moines.





EGDM works in our community to increase access to food to those in need, mitigate food waste, and advocate for local, regional, and statewide improvements to our food system. With the generous gift of \$3,250 from Central Presbyterian Church, EGDM will be able to install an additional two community fridges in the Des Moines area and make advancements to their warehouse infrastructure. Currently, the EGDM Community Fridge network is 42 fridges strong but will soon facilitate a whopping 44 fridges thanks to the congregation's donation.

### LSI Community Garden in Drake Neighborhood

In celebration of the 175th Anniversary of Central, a sub-committee of the Board of Deacons met to decide how to support God's desire for us to care for our bodies and spirits in healthy ways in our community. One of the best ways to fulfill this is in helping families grow fresh food.

An opportunity arose to support a new garden project with LSI in the Drake neighborhood. As of 2022 LSI had 20 gardens in the Central Iowa area. These gardens accommodated 198 gardeners who produced 77,430 pounds of produce for their families. This new garden will have approximately 20 plots for use by refugee clients and neighborhood residents.
